

WHAT DOES DIGITAL TV (DTT) HAVE TO OFFER?

Digital TV offers a far wider choice of TV viewing with lots of extra channels, and uses digital technology to reduce the interference that you may experience on analogue TV (the five channels you get via your standard TV aerial). Digital TV also offers other benefits, such as a greater selection of widescreen programming, and on-screen electronic programme guide, interactive services, and in some cases, Dolby 5.1 surround sound.

With the switch off of analogue signals starting in 2008, communal TV aerial systems may need converting to accept the new service.



WHAT DOES DIGITAL RADIO (DAB) HAVE TO OFFER?

More choice: A range of extra digital radio channels not available on FM, including BBC7, BBC 5 Live Extra, Core, TalkSport, Planet Rock, Life and Oneworld.

Digital quality: signals that are less prone to interference and hiss.

Improved selection: Tune in to a station by station name or format, not frequency.

Extra features: Most DAB radios support scrolling radio text, but some have extras like MP3 playback and the ability to pause or rewind live radio.

All our new installations will allow for both these digital services where available.



WHAT DOES SKY OFFER?

Hundreds of digital TV and radio channels: Loads more channels than you'll find on cable or Freeview. Channels include Sky One, Sky 2, Bravo, 10 different Sky movie channels, UK Gold, Paramount Comedy, Sky Sports, E4, BBC3, Film 4, Sci-fi channel and More 4.

Onscreen TV guide: The EPG - Electronic Programme Guide, with 7 day planner.

Pay per view: Access to pay-per-view movies and events, with Sky Box Office.

Sport: Unrivalled sports coverage with 3 Sky Sports channels, Sky Sports Extra and News, plus Eurosport and attheraces. Sky's a must for football fans.

Movies: Sky has 10 main movie channels, and two Sky Cinema channels, as well as a whole range of pay-per-view films.

WHAT DOES SKY+ OFFER?

Sky's hype on their Sky+ box is that it will '**change the way you watch TV**'... and for once, the hype isn't wrong.

Sky Plus is a combined satellite TV receiver and a personal video recorder (PVR), which records TV onto a built-in hard-disk, as opposed to video tape. This gives you a huge amount of control over how you watch TV, for example:

- Watch one Sky channel while recording another.
- Record two different channels at the same time, while watching a recorded show.
- Browse through a week's worth of TV with the on-screen programme guide, selecting which shows to record.



- Pause and rewind live TV (i.e. when the phone rings).
- The EPG - Electronic Programme Guide, with 7 day planner.
- Follow a series - The excellent 'Series link' can be used to record episodes of your favourite series automatically, keeping track of schedule changes, and avoiding repeats.
- Select recordings from your Planner, and copy them off to DVD or video.



The Sky+ box really is a top offering - you'll find you change your TV watching behaviour - no need to worry about setting the video recorder to keep up-to-date with a series, and with the drive holding around 40 hours of shows, no more running out of tape. You also find you can stagger your watching with less programme clashes, and using Live Pause means you can fast-forward through adverts.

WHAT DOES SKY HD OFFER?

Sky HD is the brand name of the HDTV service launched by BskyB to enable high definition channels on sky digital to be viewed.



The first generations of Sky HD Digibox are produced by Thomson . It is a version of the Sky+ PVR with a 300GB hard drive, 160GB of which is for consumer use, with the other 140GB reserved for future video on demand services.



For connectivity with HD ready televisions, the box outputs via a HDMI connector although Traditional standard-definition connections are also available.. The digibox also comes with a new slimline version of the Sky+ remote control.

Programmes are only broadcast in 1080i (though the box can be set to scale this to 720p if the user wishes),

The electronic programme guide (EPG) is almost identical to the one found on Sky+, with the exception being that by pressing TV Guide and then the red button on the remote control, listings for only the HD channels are shown
